I am writing to express my support for the current editorial leadership of the Journal of Asian Economics and to urge Elsevier to maintain Editors and staff who have contributed to the quality of this journal. As one who have contributed to the Journal as both author and reviewer, I have certainly noticed that the level of quality of papers published in the Journal has improved substantially in recent years. Studies of Asian economies has become increasingly important in this century as a result of the differing strategies across Asian countries towards economic growth and development. The Journal of Asian Economics has been at the frontier of this important field of study, publishing articles that are widely read and respected by Asianists and economists around the world.

Dr. Calla Wiemer has been a significant force behind the elevation of the status of the Journal of Asian Economics since taking the position of Editor-in-Chief in 2015. The citation and journal ranking statistics attest to this improvement. I have found as an author and a reviewer that Dr. Wiemer exercises sound judgement in editorial duties.
